NO 8th GRADE STUDENTS (BOYS OR GIRLS) ARE ELIGIBLE TO PRACTICE OR PLAY WITH THE HIGH SCHOOL TEAM

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION PLAYING DATES

BOYS – FIFTEEN (15), TWO (2) OF WHICH MAY BE MULTIPLE TEAM TOURNAMENTS, CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT NO LONGER EXEMPT FROM THE COUNT – LIMIT OF EIGHT (8) TEAMS

INDIVIDUAL LIMITATION – NINETEEN (19) GAMES – FOUR (4) HALVES PER DAY – WAIVED FOR MULTIPLE TEAM TOURNAMENTS

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION PLAYING DATES

GIRLS –GIRLS ARE ALLOWED TO PLAY A MAXIMUM OF SEVENTEEN (17) MATCHES PER LEVEL OF COMPETITION.

Individual Player Limitation may not exceed six (6) halves in a calendar day. There is no season match limitation for an individual player.

SCRIMMAGES

BOYS ARE ALLOWED TWO SCRIMMAGES ANY TIME DURING THE SEASON AFTER THE FIRST DAY OF PRACTICE. GIRLS ARE ALLOWED ONE SCRIMMAGE.

JAMBOREES

BOYS AND GIRLS EACH ALLOWED ONE JAMBOREE AFTER THE FIRST DAY OF PRACTICE. FOR GIRLS, UNTIL THE FIRST PLAYING DATE. FOR BOYS, ANYTIME DURING THE SEASON

TOURNAMENT GAME BALL BOYS AND GIRLS SPALDING TF-5000



MARGIN OF VICTORY

THERE IS NO MARGIN OF VICTORY FOR BOYS. FOR GIRLS, THE MATCH SHALL BE DECLARED COMPLETED WHEN ONE TEAM HAS A LEAD OF 10 GOALS AT HALFTIME OR LATER IN THE GAME.

OVERTIME

SAME OVERTIME PROCEDURE FOR BOTH BOYS AND GIRLS – ONLY DIFFERENCE IS THE GIRLS REQUIRE ALL TIED VARSITY GAMES TO HAVE OVERTIME – BOYS DO NOT

BOYS AND GIRLS OVERTIME PROCEDURE

- 1.TWO TEN MINUTE SUDDEN VICTORY OVERTIMES WILL BE PLAYED.
- 2.IF THE TIE REMAINS, PENALTY KICKS WILL BE USED. FOLLOW THE PROCEDURE ON PAGE 85 & 86 OF THE RULE BOOK, ITEMS 3, 4 AND 5.

IOWA CONDUCT RULES

ANY PLAYER RECEIVING A CAUTION (YELLOW CARD) MUST LEAVE THE GAME FOR TEN (10) CONSECUTIVE MINUTES. PENALTY WILL CARRYOVER FROM HALF TO HALF AND END OF GAME TO OVERTIME AND OVERTIME TO OVERTIME. A CAUTION IN THE SECOND OVERTIME WILL RESULT IN NO FURTHER PLAY.

IOWA CONDUCT RULES

ANY PLAYER DISQUALIFIED (RED CARD)
FOR ANY REASON MUST LEAVE THE
GAME AND A SUBSTITUTION WILL NOT BE
PERMITTED. THE TEAM WILL PLAY SHORT
FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE GAME.

ALL RED CARDS MUST BE REPORTED TO THE IOWA HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION OR THE IOWA GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC UNION.

IOWA CONDUCT RULES BOYS ONLY

ANY TEAM RECEIVING FOUR VARSITY RED **CARDS, INCLUDING COACH CARDS, WILL** NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE POST SEASON TOURNAMENT. IF THE FOURTH CARD IS RECEIVED IN A POST SEASON TOURNAMENT GAME, THE GAME WILL END AND THE TEAM WILL FORFEIT THE CONTEST.

IOWA CONDUCT RULES BOYS ONLY

ANY VARSITY COACH RECEIVING
TWO RED CARDS OVER A THREE YEAR
PERIOD WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO
COACH HIS/HER TEAM IN THE POSTSEASON TOURNAMENT FOR TWO YEARS.

ONLINE GAME REPORT BOYS ONLY

WE WANT TO CONTINUE THE ONLINE GAME REPORTING DONE LAST YEAR. FOLLOWING EACH GAME, AN ADMINISTRATOR FROM THE HOME SCHOOL, THE REFEREE(S), ASSISTANT REFEREE(S) AND BOTH HEAD COACHES NEED TO COMPLETE A REPORT. A FUTURE MAILING WILL GIVE INSTRUCTIONS INCLUDING THE WEB ADDRESS.






It is <u>recommended</u> that substitutes wear distinguishing pinnies when warming up outside of the team area.





Coaches' Responsibilities

Rule 4-3





The player who has not been cautioned must be removed and may be replaced at the time of the caution to the coach.





Misconduct

Rule 12-8-1f(10) and (11) (new)





With no change to the interpretation, an additional two reasons to display a caution card were added under unsporting conduct.



Rule 12-8-1f(12) (new)



" ... any delayed, excessive or prolonged act(s) by which a player(s) attempts to focus attention upon himself/herself and/or prohibits a timely restart of the game."


Those exact words were moved from 12-8-2a ("yellow/red disqualification") to 12-8-1f 12 (caution).





Reckless Play

Rule 18-1-1ff (new)



Definition: The player has acted with complete disregard of the danger to, or consequences for, the opponent. A player who displays reckless play shall be cautioned.



Suggested Guidelines for Management of Concussion

A concussion is a traumatic brain injury that interferes with normal brain function. An athlete does not have to lose consciousness (be "knocked out") to have suffered a con-

Common Symptoms of Concussion Include:

- · headache
- · fogginess
- difficulty concentrating
- · easily confused
- · slowed thought processes
- · difficulty with memory
- · lack of energy, tiredness
- · dizziness, poor balance
- blurred vision

- · sensitive to light and sounds
 - mood changes irritable, anxious or tearful
 - · appears dazed or stunned
- · confused about assignment
- · forgets plays
- · unsure of game, score or opponent
- · moves clumsily
- answers questions slowly
- loses consciousness
- · shows behavior or personality changes

Suggested Concussion Management:

- 1. No athlete should return to play (RTP) or practice on the same day of a concussion.
- 2. Any athlete suspected of having a concussion should be evaluated by an appropriate health-care professional that day.
- 3. Any athlete with a concussion should be medically cleared by an appropriate healthcare professional prior to resuming participation in any practice or competition.
- 4. After medical clearance, RTP should follow a step-wise protocol with provisions for delayed RTP based upon return of any signs or symptoms.





Coaches, as the adult leaders of the team, must work with their players and officials to ensure that player equipment is safe and legal.









Goals

Rule 1-4-1



If used on a football field, the front of the portable goals should be at least two yards in front of the base of the existing football goalposts.





Substitutions

Rule 3-3-1c2




A player, *including the goalkeeper*, who is injured and attended to on the field or who is deemed injured by the referee shall leave the field and may be replaced.






Other Equipment

Rule 4-2-1f, g, h (new)







Metal ankle brace coverd by sock

- f. Knee braces which are altered from the manufacturer's original design/production. Knee braces that are unaltered do not require any additional padding.
- g. Ankle braces which are altered from the manufacturer's original design/production. Non-metal ankle braces that are unaltered may be worn outside a sock. Ankle braces of metal or unyielding material that are unaltered are legal if covered by a sock. h. Re-lettered "q".

Required Equipment Rule 4-1-1i1



EFFECTIVE 2012 FALL SEASON



All team jerseys must have a different Arabic number, including goalkeeper jerseys.



Required Equipment Rule 4-1-1i2







- Only those names, patches, emblems, logos or insignias referencing the school are permitted on the team uniform, except as in 4-1-1 (d), (f) and (g).
- (d.) A manufacturer's logo/trademark appearing on both sides of the socks is legal.
- (f.) One manufacturer's logo/trademark or reference is permitted on the outside of each item which may not exceed 21/4 square inches and may not exceed 21/4 inches in any dimension.
- (g.) An American flag, not to exceed 2 by 3 inches, and either a commemorative or memorial patch, not to exceed 4 square inches and with written state association approval, may be worn on the jersey provided neither the flag nor the patch interferes with the visibility of the number.

The player's name may also appear on the team uniform.
