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ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION STARTING DATE FOR PRACTICE BOYS - MARCH 11, 2013 GIRLS – MARCH 18, 2013 FIRST COMPETITION DATE **BOYS – MARCH 28, 2013 GIRLS – APRIL 1, 2013**

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION PLAYING DATES

BOYS – FIFTEEN (15) TWO (2) OF WHICH MAY BE MULTIPLE TEAM TOURNAMENTS, CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT NO LONGER EXEMPT FROM THE COUNT – LIMITOR EIGHT (8) TEAMS. 19 GAME MAXIMUM.

INDIVIDUAL LIMITATION – NINETEEN (19) GAMES – FOUR (4) HALVES PER DAY – WAIVED FOR MULTIPLE TEAM TOURNAMENTS

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION PLAYING DATES

GIRLS –GIRLS ARE ALLOWED TO PLAY A MAXIMUM OF SEVENTEEN (17) MATCHES PER LEVEL OF COMPETITION.

Individual Player Limitation may not exceed six (6) halves in a calendar day. <u>There is no</u> season match limitation for an individual

MARGIN OF VICTORY

THERE IS NO MARGIN OF VICTORY FOR BOYS.

FOR GIRLS, THE MATCH SHALL BE DECLARED COMPLETED WHEN ONE TEAM HAS A LEAD OF <u>10 GOALS</u> AT HALFTIME OR LATER IN THE GAME.

OVERTIME

SAME OVERTIME PROCEDURE FOR BOTH BOYS AND GIRLS –

1. TWO TEN MINUTE <u>SUDDEN VICTORY</u> OVERTIMES WILL BE PLAYED.

2. IF THE TIE REMAINS, PENALTY KICKS WILL BE USED. FOLLOW THE PROCEDURE ON PAGE 84 & 85 OF THE RULE BOOK, ITEMS 3, 4 AND 5.

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION IOWA CONDUCT RULES

ANY PLAYER RECEIVING A CAUTION (YELLOW CARD) MUST LEAVE THE CAME FOR TEN (10) CONSECUTIVE MINUTES. PENALTY WILL CARRYOVER FROM HALF TO HALF AND END OF GAME TO OVERTIME AND OVERTIME TO OVERTIME. A CAUTION IN THE SECOND OVERTIME. WILL RESULT IN NO FURTHER PLAY.

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION IOWA CONDUCT RULES IHSAA ONLY

ANY TEAM RECEIVING FOUR VARSITY RED CARDS, INCLUDING COACH CARDS M NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE **POST SEASON TOURNAMENT. IF THE** FOURTH CARD IS RECEIVED IN A POST SEASON TOURNAMENT GAME, THE GAME WILL END AND THE TEAM WILL FORFEIT THE CONTEST.

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION IOWA CONDUCT RULES IHSAA ONLY

ANY VARSITY COACH RECEIVING TWO RED CARDS OVER A THREE YEAR PERIOD WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO COACH HIS/HER TEAM IN THE POST-SEASON TOURNAMENT FOR TWO YEARS.

ONLINE GAME REPORT IHSAA ONLY

WE WANT TO CONTINUE THE ONLINE GAME REPORTING DONE LAST YEAR. FOLLOWING EACH GAME, AN ADMINISTRATOR FROM THE HOME SCHOOL, THE REFEREE(S), ASSISTANT REFEREE(S) AND BOTH HEAD COACHES NEED TO COMPLETE A REPORT. A FUTURE MAILING WILL GIVE INSTRUCTIONS INCLUDING THE WEB ADDRESS.

MANDATORY STATISTICS REPORTING

Soccer coaches will be **REQUIRED** to have soccer statistics updated on the following dates:

Tuesday, April 16 at 3 PM Tuesday, April 30 at 3 PM Tuesday, May 21 at 3 PM All individual and team statistics for games played through the previous Saturday are to be included with these check dates.





MANDATORY STATISTICS REPORTING Failure to adhere to the requirements of reporting individual and team statistics by the required reporting date will result in specific sanctions from each governing organization.

GIRLS OFFICIAL RECOMMENDATIONS

Girls Coaches have <u>30 DAYS</u> after the State Soccer Tournament to submit official recommendations to the State Office.





Misconduct Rule 12-8-1f(13), 12-8-2d(1)



Penalty for an intentional hand ball by a player – other than the goalkeeper – in the penalty box to prevent a goal from being scored. If the goal is prevented, the penalty remains a disqualification of the player; however, if the goal is scored, the penalty will now be a caution to the player who deliberately handled the ball.



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When a player receives a second caution in the same game, he/she will be disqualified with a red card and the team will play the remainder of the game without replacing the disqualified player (play shorthanded).

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
Penalty Kick Rule 14-1-7 (new)



When, in the taking of a penalty kick, there is an unusual situation that causes a temporary suspension of play before the ball is played or touched by another player, or before the ball hits the goalpost or crossbar, the kick is retaken. Previously, this would have resulted in a drop ball.




Player equipment rule begins with the players wearing only legal equipment. Coaches, as the adults of their teams, must work with their players and officials to ensure that player equipment is safe and legal. Officials must also emphasize player safety and legal equipment throughout the match.




Coaching During an Injury Rule 3-3-1c1



When a coach or appropriate health-care professional is called onto the field to attend to an injured player, neither coach shall give instruction to their players.

POINT



A. Anchored

B. Goal with 3-4 sandbags

Schools, coaches and officials are reminded that all soccer goals shall be adequately anchored, secured or counterweighted to the ground for safety. The game cannot start if the goals are not adequately secured to the ground.

Concussion Management Rule 3-3-1c3



The NFHS Sports Medicine Advisory Committee has noted an increase in reported and diagnosed concussions in the 2010-2011 National High School Sports Related Injury Surveillance Study. The position of the NFHS Sports Medicine Committee is that no athlete should return to play or practice on that same day after suffering a concussion.

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When an official removes a student from participation, the following procedures are used:


A student with signs, symptoms, or behavious consistent with a concussion or brain injulted removed from participation by a contest official, the head contest referee or his/her designee, must receive written clearance from a licensed health care provider as defined in Iowa Code 280.13C before the student can return to participation in that contest/event.

If the contest is in progress, the written clearance to return shall be presented to the referee during an opportunity for a lecsubstitution.

For one day events when the head contest referee may change during the event (tournaments), written clearance to return shall be presented to the head contest referee, or his his/her designee, before the student participates again that days. The designee may be the host administrator, head event official, designated on-site licensed medical professional, etc. The student's coach, or other school-designated representative, is responsible for providing the written clearance to return to head contest referee, or his/her designee. The head contest referee, or his/her designee, will then notify the other contest officials that written clearance to return has been received.

For multiple day events when the head contest referee may change during the event, the head contest referee on the day the student was removed will make a verbal report about the injury to the tournament manager. The tournament manager will be responsible to recent the incident to the referee(s) of the contest(s) in which the student may participate on the subsequent days of the event. The referee(s) of future contests during this event must receive written clearance from a licensed health care provider as defined in Iowa Code 280.13C before the student can return to participation.


NFHS Soccer Additional Items



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ch team shall submit a team ter, containing the first and mames and numbers of all yers, substitutes, all bench rsonnel and all coaches, to officials at loast five nutes prior start of contest. The shall begin until this is nplete. Players, bench sonnel and coaches may added to the roster after start of play. Goalkeepers y have two numbers listed the roster, a goalkeeper's mber and a field player's number.





After a goar is scored by entire ream, ream A's coach may legally send substitute A13 directly into the game from the bench, without reporting to the scorer, for player A7.

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The Officials Rule 5-1-2

The officials retain clerical authority over the contest thr ligh the completion of any reports, including those imposing disgualifications, that are responsive actions occurring while the refere jurisdiction. State associations may intercede in the event of unusual incidents that occur before, during or after the officials' jurisdiction has ended or in the event that a contest is terminated prior to the conclusion of regulation play.

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


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Mimimum 10 feet






Goals Rule 1-4-1
